

How Adults Learn?



The need to know

Adults learn better when they know why they need to know@learn

Self Concept

When treated as someone who is capable and self directed, adults will develop autonomy in learning where they are responsible for decisions and directions

Adults have a lot to share and learn better from others during sharing sessions

Ready to learn

Adults are more keen to learn when they see the relevance in learning and applicable to their immediate situation

Orientation to learning
Life centered – problem or task oriented. Need for knowledge that is applicable to their environment


Motivation

Internal vs. External.
Adults learn better if they are intrinsically motivated

Basic principles of adult learning




The importance of interaction in interactive teaching

Humans are social being.

More so in the 21st century education, students need the opportunity to make sense of what they are learning. Social interaction is key.

Through interaction, they receive facilitation from others (teacher, peers and other significant members) when needed before internalization occur.

Making their voices heard and thoughts matters – influence learning engagement.







Requires activities that are exciting, challenging, motivating and rewarding







Acquisition of Knowledge

Mastery of content amongst the educators as expert Construction of knowledge amongst the learners as novices

Co construction of knowledge between expert and novice

Motivation
